
The Earth, Wind & Wire team was reborn for season 2023-24, with two new team members, T-Jay and Tom.

With Tom's natural building abilities and T-Jay's clear design and engineering vision, the team have used their determination and inspiration from the everyday to model their ideas.




While accustomed to learning independently, the pair have thrived working as a team with months of bouncing around ideas and a dash of "inane banter."


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“Alternative provision settings are beset with student placements being short-term....

At CREATED Academy, John explains that many students have a mistrust of traditional education environments, or have previously felt excluded in them. However, by connecting with other teams at events, the two boys have made friends with students from local schools. Reintroducing these young people to mainstream schools has been a true success thanks to the programme.

Highlighting the friendships the team has made, John calls this season “**a real feel-good, heartwarming story in more ways than one**”.

Tom, planning to leave CREATED Academy at the end of year 11, has hopes to join a local sixth-form’s team or return to CREATED Academy as a mentor, leaving the door open on his continued *FIRST* Tech Challenge UK journey.



“It gave me more confidence knowing that the teams know we can perform now. Everyone’s like a big community doing the same thing and having fun.”



FIRST alumni are **2-3 times** more likely to study computer science or engineering at university, and **2-5 times** more likely to work in a STEM field.

T-Jay is also looking to apply his building skills, with the ultimate goal of setting up his own motorcycle repair and customisation shop. Engineering is firmly on the horizon for these two – *FIRST* Tech Challenge UK is only the beginning.





Not to mention CREATED Academy's big plans for the future as they prepare to introduce students who have become "enamoured" with the challenge and want to get involved next season.

Having met other schools in the Stoke-on-Trent area at various events, there is a definite sense of community between CREATED Academy, St John Fisher Catholic College and St Margaret Ward Catholic Academy, who act as Champion Organisations supporting the growing mix of teams in the West Midlands.
